The Chinese, however, seem to have a different idea about the nature of this event. In a study of the people in Beijing by Gao and Lu from the Department of Foreign Languages at Beihang University in China, they found that "In Beijing, most respondents [see] Sita as an independent person who is able to make her own decisions." What do you think? Is Sita independent or not?

We've all been there: that moment when we're reading a story about a woman in need and we come to that crucial choice. This article discusses what happens when women are stripped of their agency in stories. There are different ways in which this is done. The most obvious way, is through the inclusion of violence against women. But it can also be shown by the narrative voice (see below), or through the way that female characters are handled by male characters.
